Along with tenor **Nestor Rosa**, baritone **Norm Walpole** and bass **Mac Gordon**, they formed the *Friendship Four* quartet, and enjoyed singing at local nursing homes and other venues. He was thrilled to sing with, and also under the direction of his son Bruce, and was later joined by his grandson, **Nathan**.

He chose not to pay his membership in the past year, as his health was deteriorating and he found it difficult to stand on the risers. We will miss him! ★
